▲ **Marc Chagall, Russian-French artist associated with several major styles and one of the most successful artists of the 20th century, was born**

2002: The WHO warned that without help most of the 28.5m sub-Saharan Africans living with HIV/AIDS would die over the next decade

2009: A permanent memorial for the 52 victims of the London bombings of July 7, 2005, was unveiled

2010: Former Panamanian dictator Manuel Noriega was jailed for seven years for money laundering

2012: Libya held its first national election for a generation
