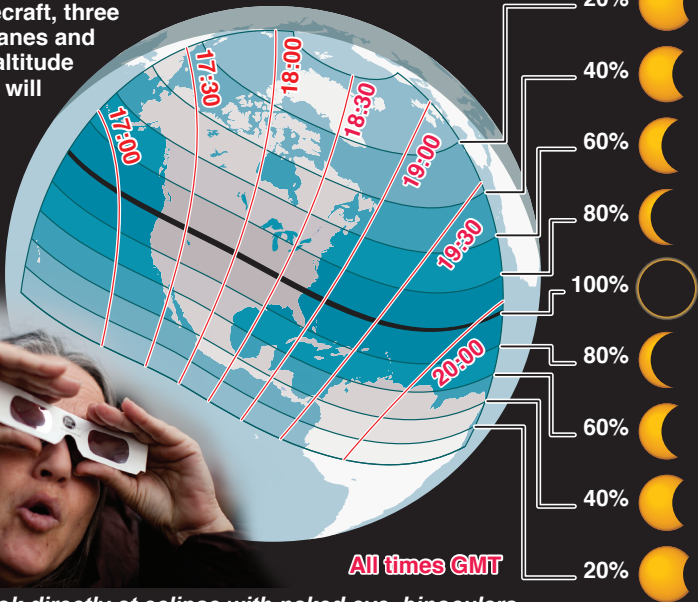


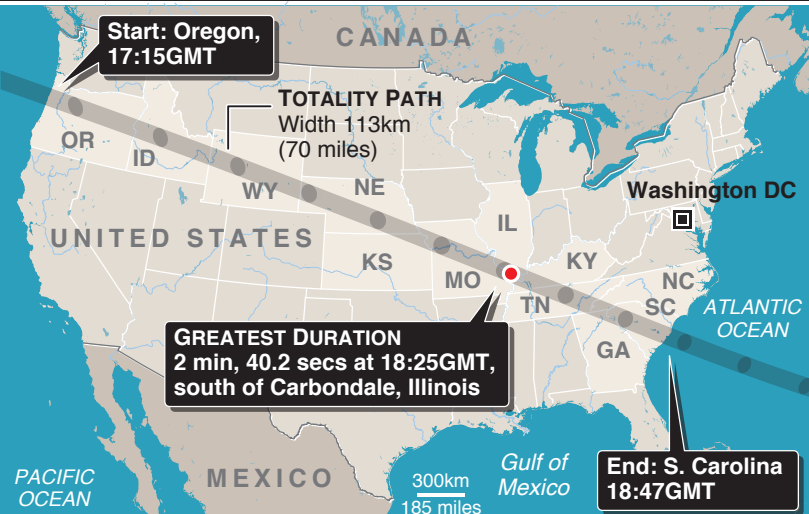
Eclipse across America: Aug 21, 2017

For the first time in almost a century, a total solar eclipse will sweep across the U.S., plunging a strip 113km wide into darkness. Outside the path of totality, skywatchers elsewhere in North America and northern South America will experience a partial eclipse

Never look directly at eclipse with naked eye, binoculars, cameras or telescopes without specialized solar filters



Over 12m people live in path of totality, 200m within one day's drive
