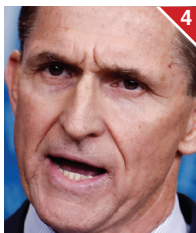


Key departures from Trump administration



1. Anthony Scaramucci, *White House communications director*. Fired 10 days into job after profanity-laced tirade against then-White House chief of staff **Reince Priebus** and Trump's chief strategist **Steve Bannon**

2. Reince Priebus, *chief of staff*. Confidant of president said Trump had lost confidence in Priebus after major legislative items failed to pass Congress



3. Sean Spicer, *press secretary*. Long-suffering but loyal spokesman resigned after Trump's appointment of Scaramucci, saying he wanted to avoid "too many cooks in the kitchen"

5. James Comey, *FBI director*. Fired by Trump in May. Comey was leading investigation into alleged ties between Trump campaign and Russia in run-up to 2016 election

4. Michael Flynn, *national security adviser*. Resigned after it emerged he discussed U.S. sanctions against Russia with Russian ambassador to U.S. before Trump took office, and misled Vice President **Mike Pence** about conversations

6. Sally Yates, *acting U.S. attorney general*. Fired by Trump after she ordered Justice Department lawyers not to enforce Trump's immigration ban

Other people fired or eased out of jobs include **Philip Bilden** (Navy secretary), **James Donovan** (deputy Treasury secretary), **Michael Dubke** (White House communications director), **Mark Green** (Army secretary), **Gerrit Lansing** (White House chief digital officer), **Todd Ricketts** (deputy secretary of commerce), and **Walter Shaub** (director of Office of Government Ethics)
