




New restrictions on travel to U.S.


President Donald Trump has signed a proclamation imposing tough new restrictions on travel to the United States from eight countries, including five that were covered by his expiring travel ban

RESTRICTIONS BY COUNTRY: New rules valid from October 18

▶ **North Korea and Syria:** Entry as immigrants and non-immigrants suspended

▶ **Chad, Libya and Yemen:** Entry as immigrants and non-immigrants on some business and tourist visas suspended

▶ **Somalia:** Entry as immigrants suspended. Non-immigrants face enhanced screening requirements

▶ **Iran:** Entry as immigrants and non-immigrants suspended, except under valid student and exchange visitor visas – with enhanced screening requirements

▶ **Venezuela:** Entry of certain government officials and their immediate family members as non-immigrants on some business and tourist visas suspended

No current valid visas will be revoked. New rules permit case-by-case waivers for citizens of affected countries who meet certain criteria – such as having previously worked or studied in U.S.
