▲ A wave of protests demanding closer European integration began in Kiev's Maidan Square. It led to revolution and the fall of Ukraine's pro-Russian president

1905: Albert Einstein published the paper which led to the mass-energy formula $E = mc^2$

1969: The first permanent ARPANET link between computers across the U.S. was established

1997: South Korea requested a \$20 billion loan from the IMF to prop up its ailing economy

2008: Stock losses in U.S. markets during 2008 were equivalent to those suffered in 1931, over 50%
