▲ A prototype of the Anglo-French supersonic aircraft Concorde was rolled out at Toulouse, France, giving the world its first glimpse of the revolutionary aircraft

1964: Che Guevara headed the Cuban delegation at the UN General Assembly

1997: The Kyoto Protocol to reduce emissions of greenhouse gases was finally agreed in Japan
