

# UEFA Nations League 2018-19

Fifty-five member associations will participate in the inaugural Nations League tournament, which aims to introduce more competitive fixtures to replace most international friendlies, and offers four places at Euro 2020 for the eventual league winners

**LEAGUE PHASE:** Each league divided into four groups, in which each team plays others home and away. Group winners gain promotion to higher league, last-placed teams are relegated to league below
