March 22, 1933

▲ The first concentration camp in Nazi Germany was opened at an abandoned munitions factory at Dachau. Over 30,000 people were killed there in 12 years

1993: Intel shipped the first Pentium chips featuring a 60 MHz clock speed

1997: The Hale-Bopp comet, returning from the outer solar system, made its closest approach to Earth, about 122 million miles

2017: A terrorist attack on London's Westminster Bridge killed five people including a police officer

2017: The newly restored tomb of Jesus at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem re-opened
