▲ The U.S. military deployed the Massive Ordnance Air Blast Bomb (MOAB), nicknamed the “Mother of all bombs”, on Islamic State targets in Afghanistan

1598: Henry IV of France proclaimed the Edict of Nantes, granting Huguenots equal rights with Catholics

1968: Tanzania became the first country to recognise the Nigerian secessionist state of Biafra

2010: A huge ice block broke off a glacier in Peru, creating a 23-metre wave that flooded four nearby towns

2010: Eurozone countries agreed an emergency loan facility of €30 billion to bail out Greece
