▲ Panama unveiled a \$5bn plan to expand the Panama Canal to cope with ships up to 50 percent wider than those then able to pass through the ageing waterway

2001: An unmanned spy plane completed the first non-stop, robotic flight across the Pacific

2005: Pope Benedict XVI, formerly Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger of Germany, was installed as the 265th pontiff
