

# Korean leaders to hold landmark summit



*Kim Jong-un* of North Korea and South Korean President *Moon Jae-in* will meet for the first time on April 27 at the “truce village” of Panmunjom for talks aimed at extending the recent détente on the Peninsula. The talks will pave the way for a historic summit between Kim and U.S. President *Donald Trump*



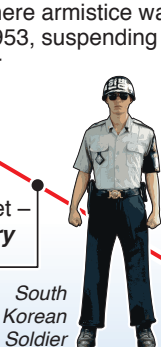
**PANMUNJOM:** Also known as **Joint Security Area (JSA)** – site where armistice was signed in 1953, suspending Korean War

Panmunjom sits inside heavily fortified 250km-long **Demilitarized Zone (DMZ)** dividing two Koreas

JSA – designated as sole place where officials from both sides could meet – is bisected by **Military Demarcation Line**

Panmunjom is last Cold War frontier where soldiers from both sides come face to face

UN Command oversees military forces supporting South Korea

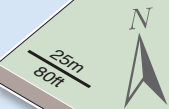

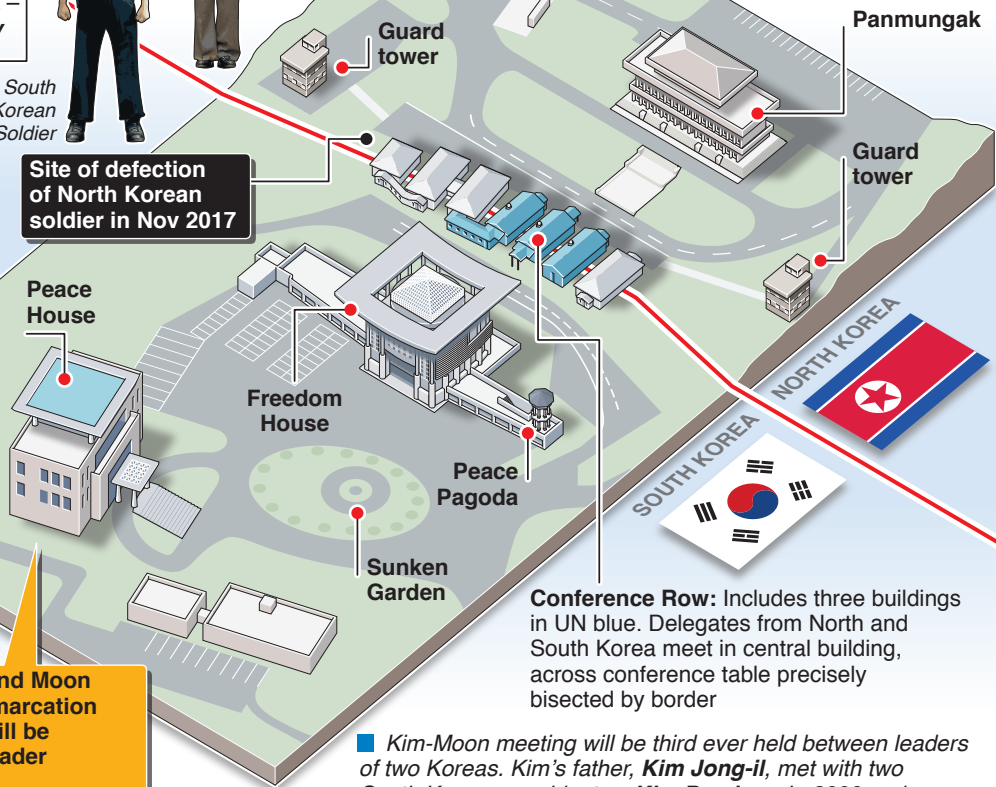
South Korean Soldier

**Peace House:** Kim and Moon to meet south of demarcation line, meaning Kim will be first North Korean leader to set foot in South since Korean War



**Conference Row:** Includes three buildings in UN blue. Delegates from North and South Korea meet in central building, across conference table precisely bisected by border

■ Kim-Moon meeting will be third ever held between leaders of two Koreas. Kim's father, **Kim Jong-il**, met with two South Korean presidents – **Kim Dae-jung** in 2000 and **Roh Moo-hyun** in 2007 – in Pyongyang
