Philippe Chatrier Court

Capacity 15,000

To be redesigned and fitted with retractable transparent roof – can be closed in 15 minutes, allowing all-weather play and night sessions

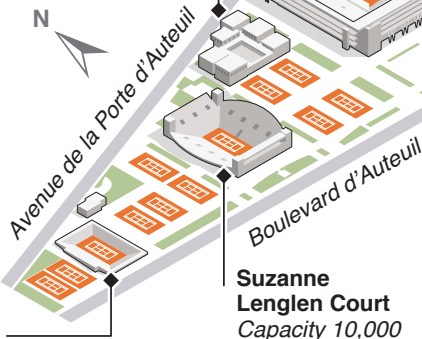
Court des Serres
