


Road to Iran's nuclear deal

U.S. President Donald Trump is threatening to scrap an internationally-brokered nuclear deal with Iran and re-impose sanctions unless the regime stops testing ballistic missiles and supporting terrorism

Nov: Iran agrees pact with U.S., UK, China, France, Germany and Russia to curb nuclear work in return for sanctions relief



Jan 2016: Iran nuclear deal – JCPOA[†] – enacted. Iran receives \$100 billion of its assets frozen in foreign banks

2015: Congress passes Iran Nuclear Agreement Review Act – INARA – which allows U.S. president to reimpose sanctions

Sep 2017: IAEA says Iran is in compliance with JCPOA. U.S. and EU say missile tests violate **UN resolution 2231** which is part of deal



May 12, 2018: Deadline under INARA for Trump to trigger sanctions
