June 4, 1993

▲ The UN agreed to send troops to Bosnia to protect six “safe havens” including Srebrenica, where 8,000 Bosnian Muslims were later murdered in 1995

2003: Liberian President Charles Taylor was indicted by a war crimes tribunal in connection with the war in Sierra Leone

2008: A historic obelisk from Ethiopia’s ancient city of Axum was reassembled after its return from Italy

2015: The data of at least four million U.S. federal employees was breached by computer hackers traced to China

2017: Eight people died in a terror attack in Britain when a van ploughed into pedestrians on London Bridge
