▲ The first drive-in cinema opened in the U.S., with space for 500 cars. Their popularity peaked in the 1950s and 60s, with 4,000 drive-ins across the country

1988: New Yorker David Stern blew the world's biggest bubble, measuring 15.24 metres in length

2003: Volkswagen announced that production of the original, classic Beetle car would cease later that year

2008: The Caribbean Monk Seal was declared officially extinct due to overhunting by humans

2013: Russian President Vladimir Putin and his wife Lyudmila were divorced after 30 years of marriage
