▲ **Soccer legend Pele, Brazil's top goalscorer who led his nation to three World Cup victories in 1958, 1962 and 1970, was born as Edson Arantes do Nascimento**

1919: The Treaty of Versailles was signed, officially ending WW1

2004: A Singapore Airlines Airbus A340-500 inaugurated the world's longest non-stop commercial service, from Singapore to Newark in the U.S.

2005: Emperor Akihito of Japan visited Saipan, scene of one of the bloodiest battles of WWII, to honour the dead

2016: An armed attack at Istanbul Atatürk Airport in Turkey killed 43 people and injured 240
