▲ A statue of a wolf suckling twins Romulus and Remus, said to have founded Rome, was revealed to date from the 13th century, instead of 500BC as previously believed

1913: The highest ever recorded shade temperature, 56.7C (134F), was measured in Death Valley, California

1973: The teenage grandson of oil tycoon Paul Getty was kidnapped

2003: The Hubble Space Telescope detected a planet twice the size of Jupiter in the Scorpius constellation

2008: Apple launched its iPhone App Store, offering 500 apps. By 2017 it featured 2.2 million apps and had generated over \$70bn in revenue
