Scott Pruitt. EPA Administrator: Resigns amid row over his ethical conduct while in office and alleged misuse of taxpayer funds
Quit, Jul 5, 2018 – 503 days in office



Lt. Gen. H. R. McMaster. National Security Adviser: President Trump fires warrior-scholar after repeated dust-ups on critical issues
Fired, Mar 22, 2018 – 396 days



Rex Tillerson. Secretary of State: Sacked by Trump on Twitter after Tillerson disagrees with Iran and North Korea policies
Fired, Mar 13, 2018 – 406 days



Gary Cohn. Chief economic adviser: Resigns after losing battle over Trump's plan to impose tariffs on steel and aluminium
Quit, Mar 6, 2018 – 411 days



Steve Bannon. Chief strategist: Describes meeting of Trump family members and Russian attorney as "treasonous"
Fired, Aug 18, 2017 – 211 days



Reince Priebus. White House chief of staff: Trump announces sacking of Priebus on Twitter and offers job to John Kelly
Fired, Jul 28, 2017 – 190 days



Hope Hicks. Communications director: Admits to House Intelligence Committee that she told "white lies" on Trump's behalf
Quit, Feb 28, 2018 – 405 days



Omarosa Manigault-Newman. Director of communications-public liaison: Resigns over "concerns" about administration
Quit, Jan 20, 2018 – 366 days



Rob Porter. Staff Secretary: Resigns amid allegations of domestic violence from two ex-wives. Porter denies accusations
Quit, Feb 7, 2018 – 384 days



Sean Spicer. Press Secretary: Leaves in protest over Trump's decision to hire Anthony Scaramucci as communications director
Quit, Jul 21, 2017 – 183 days



Michael Flynn. National security adviser: Forced to resign after secretly discussing U.S. sanctions with Russian Ambassador
Fired, Feb 13, 2017 – 25 days



Katie Walsh. Deputy chief of staff: Quoted saying working with Trump is "like trying to figure out what a child wants"
Quit, Mar 30, 2017 – 70 days
