August 6, 1538

▲ **Bogotá, capital of Colombia, was founded by Spanish explorer Gonzalo Jiménez de Quesada. Its indigenous name was Bacatá, meaning “The Lady of the Andes”**

1928: American artist Andy Warhol, one of the pioneers of pop art, was born

1991: The world’s first website went on line; info.cern.ch running on a NeXT computer at CERN in Switzerland

1998: Monica Lewinsky testified before the U.S. grand jury about her relationship with President Bill Clinton

2014: The ESA spacecraft Rosetta reached 67P/Churyumov-Gerasimenko, becoming the first man-made object to orbit a comet
