▲ The governor of the U.S. state of Alabama prevented public school integration of black and white students by deploying state troopers around school buildings

1823: Simon Bolivar became president of Peru

1921: The world's first motorway opened in Berlin, Germany

1981: Picasso's Spanish Civil War painting Guernica was transferred to Madrid after 42 years in New York. Picasso vowed it would not enter Spain until democracy was restored
