▲ Months after returning from an 18-year exile Juan Peron was elected president of Argentina for a third time, and his wife Isabel was named vice-president

1912: Silent film director Mack Sennett released his first Keystone Cops movie, entitled *Cohen Collects a Debt*

1953: WD-40, an oil that displaced water to prevent rust, was invented

1998: A pioneering French transplant gave a patient a new right forearm and hand following a chainsaw accident
