September 30, 1938

▲ **British prime minister Neville Chamberlain declared there would be “peace in our time” after the signing of the Munich Agreement with Adolf Hitler in Germany**

1902: “Artificial silk”, a cellulose-based fibre made from wood-pulp, also known as rayon or Viscose, was patented

1949: Mao Zedong was elected Chairman of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China

2003: President Paul Kagame won Rwanda’s first parliamentary elections since the 1994 genocide

2003: Air France and Dutch rival KLM joined forces to create Europe’s largest airline
