

Security tight in Buenos Aires for G20

Argentina's capital is under a total security shutdown as the heads of state of the world's 20 biggest economies meet for the G20 summit

SECURITY (Nov 29-Dec 1)

- Around 3,000 army troops deployed, alongside 22,000 police and security forces
- All flights over city diverted
- Trains, subways and all public transport cancelled
- Friday declared public holiday



U.S.: Three **E-3 Awacs** surveillance aircraft and three **KC-135** refuelling aircraft will monitor city. **USS Carl Vinson** aircraft carrier and 400 troops stationed in neighbouring Uruguay
