

Corruption allegations against Netanyahu

Israeli police have recommended indicting Benjamin Netanyahu on bribery charges, adding to a catalogue of legal troubles that have clouded the Israeli Prime Minister's prospects for re-election in 2019

Police recommendation

Indict Netanyahu for bribery, fraud and breach of trust



■ Netanyahu accused of accepting luxury gifts worth almost \$300,000 in return for political favours



■ Alleged gifts – from Hollywood producer **Arnon Milchan** (above, top) and Australian tycoon **James Packer** (above) – included champagne, cigars and jewellery from 2007-2016

CASE 4000

Police recommendation

Indict Netanyahu and his wife **Sara** (right) for bribery and fraud

■ Involves Netanyahu's relationship with **Shaul Elovitch**, controlling shareholder of Israel's telecom giant **Bezeq**

■ Confidants of Netanyahu allegedly backed regulatory changes worth hundreds of millions of dollars to Bezeq in return for positive press coverage of him and his wife on Bezeq's popular news site **Walla**

■ Involves alleged secret talks between Netanyahu and **Arnon Mozes**, owner of Israel's daily **Yedioth Ahronoth**
