

Murray set to bow out

Three-time Grand Slam champion Andy Murray is hoping to play the final match of his illustrious career on the grass of Centre Court at his beloved Wimbledon

RISE OF ANDY MURRAY

- **2005:** Pro debut in Barcelona, aged 18 – reaches third round at Wimbledon, losing to Nalbandian
- **2006:** First ATP title in San Jose
- **2008:** Maiden Grand Slam final at **U.S. Open**. Claims first Masters titles in Cincinnati and Shanghai
- **2012:** Suffers heartbreaking loss to Roger Federer in **Wimbledon** final – before defeating Federer to win gold at London Olympics, and sealing first major at U.S. Open (right)
- **2013:** Beats Djokovic to become first British man to win Wimbledon since Fred Perry in 1936



■ **2015:** Leads Great Britain to first **Davis Cup** crown since 1936, with victory over Belgium

■ **2016:** Nine titles in stellar year include second Wimbledon and Olympic gold, and first ATP Finals triumph – ends year as world No. 1

■ **2017:** Reaches semis at Roland Garros, but hip injury forces end to season before U.S. Open. Loses No. 1 ranking after 41 weeks at top

■ **2019:** Reveals aim to end career at Wimbledon, following struggle to recover from hip surgery. After battling five-set loss in Australian Open first round he says: "I'd be okay with that being my last match"
