▲ A new territory, Nunavut, “our land”, was created in Canada to provide autonomy for the Inuit people. It comprises most of the Canadian Arctic archipelago

1889: The first commercial dishwashing machine was marketed in Chicago

1919: Germany’s Bauhaus school, combining crafts with the fine arts, was founded by Walter Gropius

1939: Nationalist forces under General Francisco Franco declared an official end to the Spanish Civil War when the Republican forces surrendered

2004: The high-speed Korea Train Express (KTX) averaging speeds of 300km per hour, entered service
