May 23, 1934

▲ **U.S. outlaws Bonnie and Clyde died in a police shootout. Their exploits, robbing small stores, gas stations and banks, were later immortalised in film**

1949: The German Federal Republic formally came into existence, with the capital based in Bonn

1960: Adolf Eichmann, fugitive Nazi and key figure behind the Holocaust, was captured in Argentina

1994: Quentin Tarantino's Pulp Fiction proved a controversial winner of the Palme d'Or at the Cannes Film Festival

1995: The first version of Java, used by both Google and Android Inc., was released by Sun Microsystems
