June 10, 1829

▲ The first Oxford and Cambridge Boat Race was held in Henley, won by Oxford. Held annually since 1856, Cambridge now have 84 race victories to Oxford's 80

1909: The SOS distress signal was first used

1935: Alcoholics Anonymous was founded in Ohio, to help alcoholics stay sober and others to achieve sobriety

1954: An aerial search party found over 100,000 people isolated from the world in the highlands of Papua New Guinea

1999: NATO suspended its bombing against Yugoslavia after Serbia agreed to withdraw troops from Kosovo
