▲ **Zimbabwe's presidential elections were the first in 37 years without Robert Mugabe's name on the ballot. Emmerson Mnangagwa narrowly retained power**

2001: Canada became the first country in the world to legalise the use of marijuana for medical purposes

2004: The UN called on Sudan to disarm the Arab Janjaweed militia, responsible for the massacre of tens of thousands in the Darfur region

2012: A power cut in northern India left 700m people without electricity across 22 of the country's 28 states

2014: Argentina defaulted on its debt for the third time in 25 years
