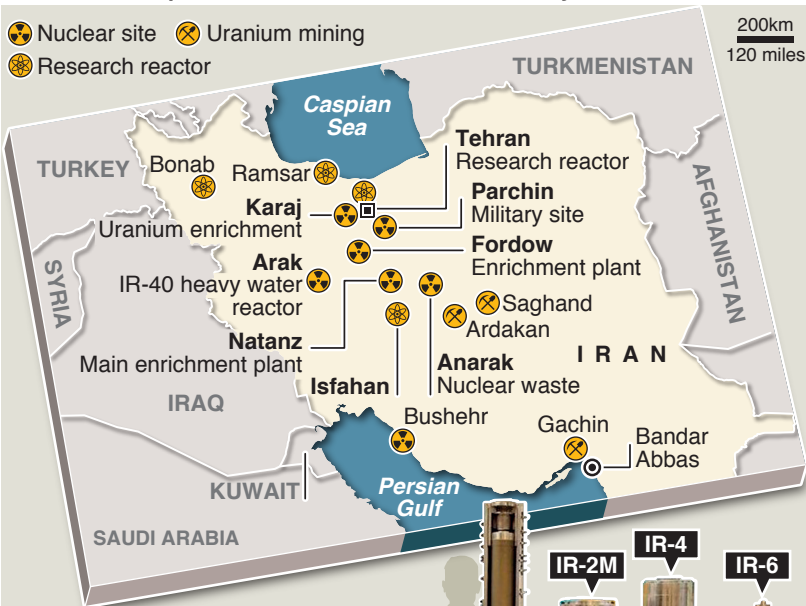


Iran pushes limits of nuclear deal

Iran says that it will gradually scale back its adherence to the 2015 nuclear pact unless European signatories keep to their obligations and compensate Tehran for losses inflicted by U.S. sanctions

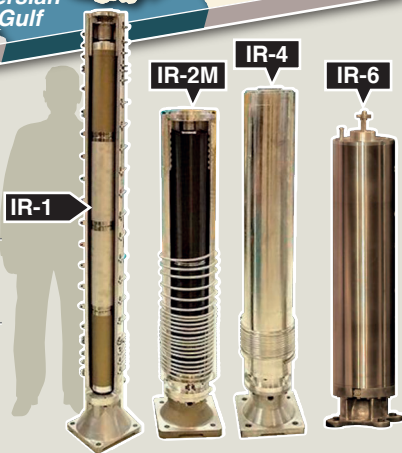


■ **2015 nuclear deal:** *Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action* agreed between U.S., France, Germany, UK, Russia and China

■ **May 2018:** U.S. withdraws from JCPOA, citing failure to address Iran's ballistic missile programme

■ **Arak:** Nuclear core rendered unusable under JCPOA. New IR-40 core could enable production of 9-10kg of plutonium per year – enough for one to two nuclear weapons

■ **Uranium stockpile:** Iran can keep no more than 300kg of low-enriched uranium capped at 3.67% purity. Iran could boost enrichment to 20% using advanced centrifuges



■ **Centrifuges:** Iran is limited to operating 5,060 older-model **IR-1** centrifuges. Iran is barred under accord from operating **IR-2M**, **IR-4** and **IR-6** centrifuges which can produce three to 10 times more enriched uranium
