

North Korea fires two projectiles into sea

North Korea has fired a new type of short-range ballistic missile from its east coast, its first launches in more than two months as officials from Pyongyang and Washington struggle to restart nuclear negotiations

Wonsan: Two short-range missiles fired from mobile launchers, flying 430km and 690km respectively before landing in sea. Both reached altitude of 50km



Weapons could be similar to two launched by North Korea in May. Experts said those missiles – likely *Scud-C* or *KN-23* – strongly resembled Russia's nuclear-capable *Iskander* missile that has been in Moscow's arsenal for more than 10 years
