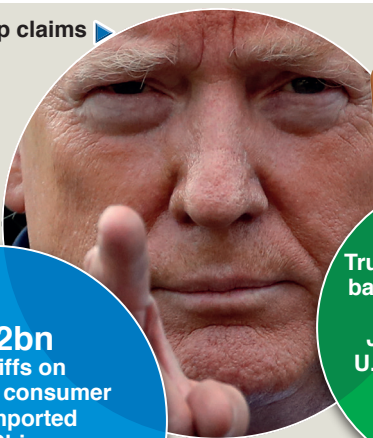


# Toll of Trump's trade war mounts

President Trump claims that China pays tariffs he has imposed on Chinese goods

*Tariffs are paid by U.S. importers and consumers*



**\$28bn**

Trump administration's bailout to U.S. farmers

Jul 2018-May 2019:  
U.S. soybean exports to China fall 77%,  
from \$11.2bn to \$2.5bn

**\$38.2bn**

25% tariffs on \$152.9bn of consumer goods imported from China



**Growing cost of consumer goods**

Cost of steel and aluminium tariffs to U.S. manufacturers

Increased cost of Chinese auto parts to General Motors, Fiat Chrysler, Caterpillar and Harley-Davidson



**U.S. imports from China: \$539.68 billion (Jan-Dec 2018)**

**Jul 2018:** Tariffs of 25% on \$34bn of mainly agricultural products

**Sep:** 10% tariffs on \$200bn of products, including \$152.9bn of consumer goods  
**May 2019:** Tariffs raised from 10% to 25%



**Aug:** 25% tariffs on \$16bn, including industrial products

**Aug 1:** Trump announces 10% tariffs on remaining \$300bn of imports

**Aug 5:** China lets yuan slump below key 7-per-dollar level
