Nearly 12,000 people, including 3,500 media, will attend

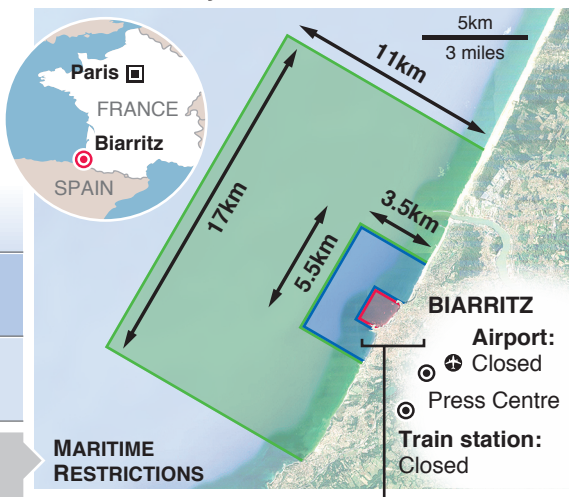
❑ All water activities prohibited
