▲ Over 2,000 people were crushed or suffocated in the deadliest ever stampede at the annual Hajj pilgrimage near Mecca. Over 400 victims were from Iran

2006: NASA recorded the largest ozone hole in the atmosphere to that date, some 10.6 million square miles

2009: Britain's largest ever haul of Anglo-Saxon gold and silver was unearthed in a field in Staffordshire

2010: Brazilian semi-public energy company Petrobras raised \$67 billion in the world's largest share offer

2017: Chancellor Angela Merkel won a fourth term in Germany's election, despite gains by the far-right
