




High-level White House departures

U.S. national security adviser John Bolton is the latest in a series of notable departures under President Donald Trump



◀ **John Bolton**, *National Security Adviser*
At odds with Trump over many foreign policy issues. **Forced out, Sep 10, 2019**



Dan Coats, *Director of National Intelligence* ▶
Two-year tenure marked by strained relations with President. **Left role, Aug 15, 2019**



◀ **Kirstjen Nielsen**, *Homeland Security Sec.*
Departed amid Trump's growing frustration over immigration policy. **Resigned, Apr 7, 2019**



Jim Mattis, *Defence Secretary* ▶
Clashed with Trump over withdrawal of U.S. troops from Syria. **Resigned, Dec 20, 2018**



◀ **John Kelly**, *Chief of Staff*
Served for 17 months before departing in White House reshuffle. **Left role, Dec 2018**



Jeff Sessions, *Attorney General* ▶
Pushed out after year-long spat with President. **Fired, Nov 7, 2018**



◀ **Nikki Haley**, *Ambassador to UN*
Differed from Trump's more isolationist views, but departed amicably. **Resigned, Oct 9, 2018**



H.R. McMaster, *National Security Adviser* ▶
Respected three-star general exited amid ructions with President. **Fired, Mar 22, 2018**



◀ **Rex Tillerson**, *Secretary of State*
Rocky, 13-month tenure abruptly terminated by Trump via Twitter. **Fired, Mar 13, 2018**



Gary Cohn, *National Economic Council head* ▶
Fought losing battle with Trump over steel and aluminium tariffs. **Resigned, Mar 6, 2018**



◀ **Steve Bannon**, *Chief Strategist*
Divisive figure ousted by President after seven months. **Left role, Aug 19, 2017**



Michael Flynn, *National Security Adviser* ▶
Forced out after discussing U.S. sanctions with Russian ambassador. **Fired, Feb 13, 2017**
