


Major pledges at UN climate summit


GOVERNMENT PLEDGES


77 Countries committing to cut emissions to net zero by 2050. Excludes biggest carbon polluters – China, U.S., India, Russia and Japan


70 Countries pledging to do more to fight climate change


12 Countries making financial commitments to **Green Climate Fund** to help developing countries


 **France:** Will not make trade agreements with countries not following Paris climate agreement


 **Germany:** Committed to carbon neutrality by 2050


 **UK:** Doubling international climate finance from 2020-25

 **India:** Increasing its share of renewable energy by 2022

 **China:** Cutting emissions by 12 billion tonnes annually

 **EU:** At least 25% of next budget to tackle climate change

 **Russia:** 187th country to ratify Paris agreement


 **Pakistan:** Planting 10 billion trees over next five years

Aiming to make all buildings reach net zero emissions by 2050

 **Climate Investment Platform**
Seeking to mobilise \$1 trillion in clean energy investment by 2025

 **Three Percent Club:** Coalition of countries and businesses working to drive three percent annual global increase in energy efficiency

 **Cool Coalition:** Setting national cooling targets to potentially avoid one degree of warming by 2050
