

U.S. boosting military ties with Poland

President Donald Trump and his Polish counterpart Andrzej Duda have agreed to an enhanced U.S. military presence in Poland, with troops based at six locations to counter potential Russian threats

U.S. troops in Poland: About 4,500 currently on rotation, expected to grow by additional 1,000
