October 30, 1894

▲ A patent was obtained for industrial production of the Italian sweet bread, Pandoro. Meaning Golden Bread, it was previously affordable only to the rich

1934: Italian dictator Benito Mussolini ordered all six to eight-year-olds to undertake pre-military training

1974: Muhammad Ali regained the world heavyweight boxing title by knocking out George Foreman

1989: Socialist Prime Minister Felipe Gonzalez clinched an absolute majority in Spain's general election

2009: Jacques Chirac, ex-president of France, was ordered to stand trial for corruption while he was mayor of Paris
