November 30, 1934

▲ The Flying Scotsman was the first steam locomotive to travel at 100mph (160.9km/h). It entered service in 1928 and was retired in 1963 after travelling over 2m miles

1924: The first photographs were transmitted by radio across the Atlantic

1939: Over 20 Russian divisions invaded Finland in the “Winter War”

1982: Michael Jackson released his sixth studio album, Thriller, which became the biggest-selling album of all time with estimated global sales of at least 66 million copies

2009: The particle beams of the Large Hadron Collider reached over one trillion electron volts
