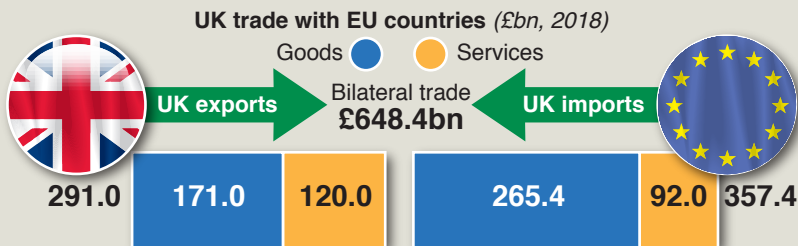


UK-EU trade in goods and services

UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson hopes to sign a free trade agreement with the EU by the end of 2020. While the EU enjoys a bilateral trade surplus in goods, the UK is far more competitive in services
