In the coming weeks, 100 lawmakers in the U.S. Senate will decide whether President Donald Trump should be removed from office for seeking Ukraine's intervention in the 2020 presidential race

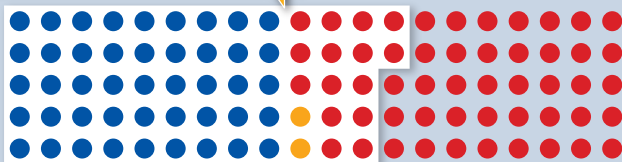

JURY

After hearing arguments from both sides – and any witnesses – senators are given full day to deliberate before vote on conviction is held

Two-thirds majority (67 votes) required to convict president

Republicans control 100-seat Senate with 53-47 majority
