▲ The city of New Delhi was inaugurated as the capital of India. It houses all three branches – legislative, executive and judicial – of the Government of India

1763: France ceded Canada to Britain in the Treaty of Paris

1985: ANC leader Nelson Mandela refused an offer of freedom from jail that was conditional on his renouncing violence

2005: Playwright Arthur Miller, author of *Death of a Salesman*, died aged 89

2005: Voters in Saudi Arabia took part in the first ever nationwide elections, but only men were allowed to vote or stand for office
