

# FIM MotoGP World Championship 2020

In 1949, the *Federation Internationale de Motocyclisme* founded the Road Racing World Championship, staging just six Grands Prix in Europe. Now a global brand with multiple races each year, MotoGP is firmly established as the premier class of motorcycle racing

**FIERCE RIVALRY:** **Valentino Rossi** and **Marc Marquez** have endured a heated rivalry, featuring numerous collisions and controversial overtaking. Alongside Italian legend **Giacomo Agostini** they top the record tables for most race wins in the 500cc class

## Proud heritage

- 1949: **Leslie Graham** wins inaugural 500cc World Championship
- 1961: Argentina hosts first race outside Europe
- 1968: **Giacomo Agostini** wins 350cc and 500cc crowns
- 1978-93: Era dominated by U.S. riders such as **Kenny Roberts**, **Eddie Lawson** and **Wayne Rainey**, and Japanese constructors Yamaha, Honda and Suzuki
- 1983: Honda win first of record 21 championships, with American rider **Freddie Spencer**
- 1998: **Mick Doohan** secures fifth title
- 2002: Rebranding of World Championship as **MotoGP**
- 2013: **Marc Marquez** becomes youngest ever world champion in debut season, aged 20
- 2019: **Andrea Dovizioso** sets new speed record of 356.7km/h (221.6mph) at Mugello Circuit in Italy



## Roll call of champions

In pre-MotoGP era, Agostini also won seven 350cc titles and further 54 Grands Prix, taking both championships in five consecutive years from 1968-72

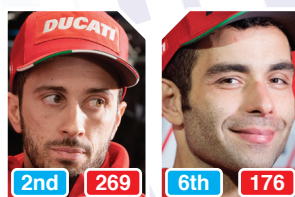

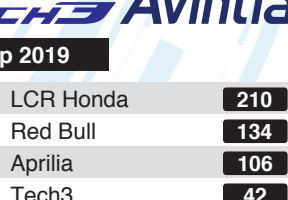

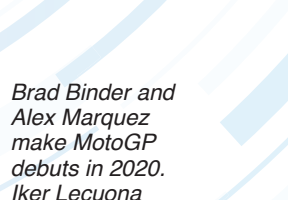
