February 25, 1875

▲ The Guangxu Emperor of China began his reign, aged three, with Empress Dowager Cixi as regent. He was the penultimate emperor of the Qing Dynasty

1455: Johannes Gutenberg, who pioneered printing with movable type, printed his first Bible in Germany

1964: Kim Il-sung of North Korea called for all cooperative farms to become state-run collectives

1990: Nicaragua's U.S.-backed coalition, led by Violeta Chamorro, defeated Daniel Ortega's Sandinista government

1994: A Jewish settler massacred 43 Muslims at a Hebron mosque before being beaten to death
