▲ The Schengen Treaty, to abolish border checks between European Union states, came into force. The zone now covers 26 countries and more than 400 million people

1954: The first colour television went on sale for around \$1,000, roughly the same cost as a car at that time

1975: King Faisal of Saudi Arabia was assassinated by his nephew, Prince Faisal. He was succeeded by his brother, Khaled bin Abdul-aziz

1995: WikiWikiWeb, the world's first user-editable website, was created

2015: Saudi Arabia launched air strikes in Yemen against Iranian-backed Houthi militants
