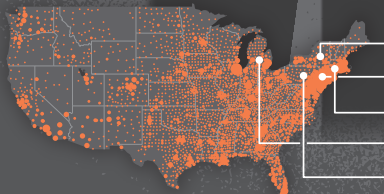
World War One†

†Apr 6, 1917:
U.S. declares war on Germany

Summer 1918:
U.S. soldiers begin to arrive on Western Front at rate of 10,000 per day

Of U.S. casualties, 45,000 die of Spanish Flu – 30,000 before they reach France
