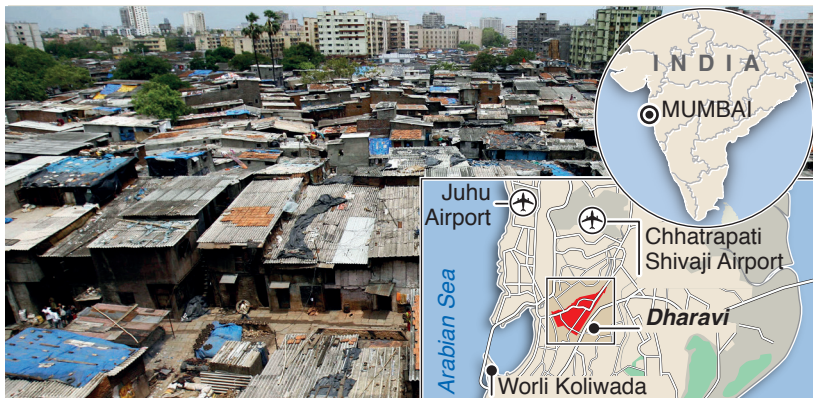


Virus battleground in Mumbai slum
