▲ The first drive-in cinema opened in the U.S., with space for 500 cars. Their popularity peaked in the 1950s and 60s, with 4,000 drive-ins across the country

1994: A drawing for a first edition of a Tintin comic book was auctioned for a record \$100,000 in Paris

1995: Japan's government agreed to express "deep remorse" for acts of aggression in World War II

2010: Scientists revealed that Titan, one of Saturn's moons, could potentially support life

2015: Barcelona beat Juventus to win the UEFA Champions League final for the fifth time
