▲ The Papal Inquisition forced astronomer Galileo Galilei to recant his then-heretical theory that the Earth and other planets revolved around the sun

1580: Abraham Verhoeven, publisher of the world's first newspaper in 1605, was born in Antwerp, Belgium

2007: Inflation in Zimbabwe rose to 11,000 percent

2010: Jamaican police arrested suspected drug lord Christopher "Dudus" Coke on the outskirts of Kingston

2015: Hollywood composer James Horner, who won two Oscars for *Titanic*, was killed when his private plane crashed in southern California
