


Foreign involvement in Libya's war

The conflict between Libya's UN-recognised Government of National Accord (GNA) and Khalifa Haftar's so-called Libyan National Army (LNA) is drawing increasing involvement from foreign powers


BACKING GNA


 **Turkey:** Support has been key to reversing LNA gains. Has supplied drones, air defences and advisers, and recruited pro-Turkish Syrian opposition fighters to bolster GNA forces

 **Italy:** Sent troops to train GNA forces

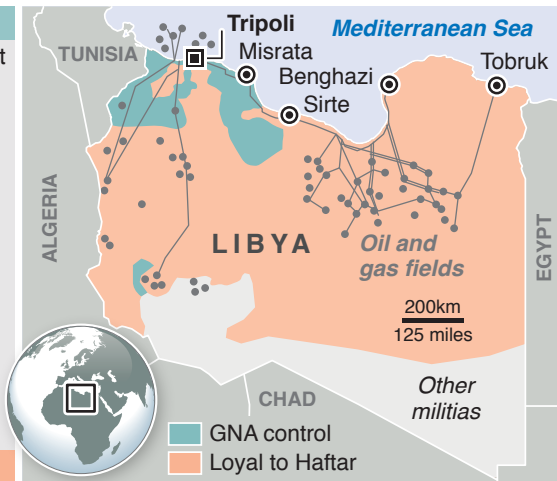
 **Qatar:** Military and economic assistance


BACKING LNA


 **UAE:** Supplied Haftar with drones, Russian-built air defences and armoured vehicles. Accused by GNA of conducting air strikes and shipping in African mercenaries

 **Russia:** Wagner group has up to 1,200 mercenaries in Libya. U.S. says Moscow has sent fighter jets to support them

 **Egypt:** Key channel for arms and mercenaries, according to analysts. Security sources say air strikes have been launched from Egyptian soil



 **Jordan:** Provided training and arms to LNA fighters

 **France:** Broadly supports Haftar while officially recognising GNA
